Remarks made by Elliott Auerbach at the ceremonies officially opening Glusker Gardens Senior Apartments on June 20th, 2003:

If anybody deserved the title Mr. Ellenville, it would have been Eugene "Gene" Glusker, who would have worn

it proudly.

He was a favorite son who returned to his community after graduating Ellenville High School in 1930 and going on to continue his education at Cornell University and the

Wharton School of Business.

Gene, a local business icon, a devoted husband, father, and grandfather, began to make his mark on his hometown through public service. His unprecedented seven consecutive terms as Ellenville's mayor set the tone for the Village as we know it today.

Mayor Glusker, following his commitment to work on the issues for the greater good of the community, changed public policy and set many precedents. He is credited

with:

Appointing the first woman trustee; Naming the first police officer of color; Establishing the first senior citizens center; Appointing the first planning commission; Creating the "manager form of government"; Installing and upgrading the water and sewer system; Supporting affordable housing; Building a new Village Hall; Instituting new zoning ordinances; and reconstructing flood control.

Gene was an advocate for mental health and played an important statewide role in the Conference of Mayors. He was recognized for his contributions to the community when he was named Noonday Club Citizen of the Year.

The spirit of Eugene Glusker, Mr. Ellenville, is represented here today as we dedicate this complex bearing his name to serving the community that he loved.
